
ISN'T THERE MORE WE CAN DO?

Grace House Akron is a not-for-profit organization founded in 2016 with the vision of helping people like Elizabeth. We believe all individuals deserve a death with dignity. Grace House is a new nonprofit organization that provides a caring environment to terminally ill individuals enrolled in a hospice program who would otherwise spend their last days alone or in undesirable environments. We provide support and acceptance to patients in the final stages of life, while ensuring that their basic needs of food, water, shelter and comfort are met. All services are free-of-charge, allowing individuals to pass peacefully without financial barriers to care.

Grace House was founded by Holly Klein, a former home hospice nurse and administrator who saw underprivileged and under-insured patients continually falling through the gaps in our health care system. She knew that we could do better as a community and as a society. She started exploring models of care that would allow for equity and serenity at the end of life for those in greatest need. Grace House and its services are modeled after residences in the Omega Home Network, a national consortium whose philosophy is to build homes that reflect the spirit of the communities that come together to create and sustain them. Further discussions with local palliative care and hospice professionals, including Dr. Kevin Dieter and Dr. Steven (Skip) Radwany, led to one simple question: *"Isn't there more we can do?"*

After multiple site visits, research and discussions with interested and deeply concerned community leaders, co-founders Cindy and Nick Browning joined Holly to build a board of highly engaged individuals which led to the cultivation of early support and identification of our campaign's honorary chair, Dr. Cliff Deveny, CEO of Summa Health. Through his added leadership, Grace House was gifted a generous donation of land by Summa Health and will be located at 475 North Howard Street in the North Hill neighborhood of Akron.

NEED FOR THE PROGRAM



MEET JIM

Jim is 48 years old with terminal lung cancer. He is estranged from his family and bounces between friends' homes. His friends are not able to care for him as his health declines. Because he has no home of his own, his hospice team finds it difficult to care for Jim. Sometimes they are unable to locate him for visits. He does not have the financial resources for rent or different housing options.



No organization like Grace House exists in Summit County or the Greater Akron region. Grace House will serve as a model for other communities to make care universally available to the terminally ill regardless of their socioeconomic status.

Besides the ethical and moral obligation of our society to care for the most vulnerable, studies show hospice care decreases healthcare costs by reducing hospital stays and other related medical costs. Grace House will be part of the solution, by helping to decrease the burden on area healthcare facilities and hospice programs. We anticipate serving 40-60 patients annually with an estimated length of stay between 30-50 days each.

Another key role for Grace House is to spark broader community conversations about access to end-of-life care for those in need, resulting in a shared and deeper understanding of what that means for individuals receiving care, their families and other caregivers. Providing advocacy, education, and support resources will be another essential program goal and service.

DID YOU KNOW?

Hospice is a philosophy of care, not a physical building or facility. Hospice care can be received in any environment the patient prefers.

The burden of care for many hospice patients falls to family and friends. For individuals with no family or the inability to pay for private caregivers, this can result in undignified conditions and a death with suffering. They may die in social isolation, with few people around them and little support.

12% of Summit County residents (about 64,920) fall below the poverty level. Many face housing insecurity and do not have access to, or financial means for, caregivers at the end of life. A terminal illness increases the risk of losing housing and decreases access to care.

PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

Grace House staff will serve as surrogate, extended family members to residents, while local hospice programs provide medical management and quality end-of-life care. Grace House caregivers and volunteers will provide services around the clock.

SERVICES WILL INCLUDE:

- Pet Therapy
- Music and Art Therapy
- Therapeutic Massage
- Vigil Companions
- Spiritual Care
- 24-Hour Care
- Self-Care for Families and Staff





Grace House will also provide experiential learning opportunities to help develop and educate future healthcare professionals from NEOMED (Northeastern Ohio Medical School) and other local universities to meet the needs of these underserved, terminally ill individuals.

As part of their curriculum, medical, nursing and health science students will document patient narratives through expressive writing, journaling or storytelling. Patients will serve as "teachers" as students capture the details of challenges faced during their journey to Grace House. We will promote an environment that values listening, respect and human dignity, and students will have the opportunity to build a deeper understanding about the importance of dialogue and the role of being present during end-of-life care.





CAMPAIGN DETAILS

The Built on Love Campaign is raising \$2.8 million to cover construction of a six-bedroom home, the first two years of operating expenses, seed funding for a Grace House endowment, and nominal campaign costs.

The 6,370 square-foot facility will be built on a three-quarter acre lot adjacent to St. Thomas Hospital, near downtown Akron, with a projected construction cost of \$1.8 million. This includes landscaping, exterior fencing and features such as a memorial garden, a Dignity Path, a pavilion, plus needed furnishings, fixtures and equipment, including solar panels.

Annual operating costs for the organization are projected to be \$360,000 per year. Grace House will not receive funding from local, county, state or federal governments. The service model will rely on philanthropy and generous partnerships with individuals, corporations and foundations—built and sustained entirely on love!



With that, the Grace House Board of Directors and Built on Love Campaign Steering Committee agreed to raise initial operating funds and will seed an endowment to grow and help sustain the services.

Grace House is fortunate to have received several early in-kind and cash donations supporting specific equipment and fixture needs (such as resident beds and solar panels). And of course, this project would not be possible without the generous donation of land from Summa Health, valued at approximately \$58,000.

TIMELINE

The projected timeline for fundraising and construction (as of August 2020) is as follows. Fundraising in a COVID-19 landscape may impact this to some degree, but onward we go!
